
What is the name of your education for EFT?

Is your education divided in levels or modules? 18 responses






Names of levels/ modules?

- Postgraduate studies can be basic, with diferent specific areas. THE masters are only for advanced level, for students learn to measure and evaluate the sessions.

If you dont have same teachers during whole educationspecify how you choose teachers in different tasks/levels/ modules?

- <u>Senior Tutor</u> is lead tutor for each module but <u>supported by less experienced</u> tutors who take some individual sessions or share sessions with the senior tutor
- In hippotherapy courses we have only pt, OT teachers and in therapeutic riding courses other specialties as psychologists or special pedagogic teachers
- For the masters only with Phd, and experience. For postgraduate studies with professional certification. For the master can be a statistical, but there is a multidisciplinar team. LIKE in the ISAAT
- By experience or by typology of approach to the horse world
- That depense against, but if there are different teachers<u>, they work together</u> in developing the whole education.
- According to the subject taught specialist for the subject, university education (BSc, MSc), min of 5 y experience in the field
- Partially teachers are repeated. During the workshops <u>expanding knowledge</u> <u>to the team of instructors</u>, new teachers confirmed by the organization join.

Who makes the selection of a new teacher?

- ACPEA Training& Education committee
- The person who is in Charge of the facility and is scientific responsible
- Our scientific Board
- Dipends on the school you are following. For mine is the master teacher

- CEFTA Education commettee
- Teachers are selected by the Main Board of the organization on the basis of information about the teacher's qualifications and experience gathered about the teacher. The selection is then re-verified in two ways: the training course coordinator listens to the lectures and, at the end of the course, a participant survey is carried out in which they evaluate individual teachers.

What criteria do you have for a teacher?

- Must have post -grad training in specialism. Current clinical practice in EFT. Some teaching training or experience
- As far as hippotherapy concerns the first criteria is to be a well trained therapist in his or her specialty e.g NDT trained or another neurological method and also knowledge about horse and its biomechanics
- We don't want to focus on professional education. We want to focus on posgraduate studies. The students need to learn a lot about scientific methodology, eg. statistics, and have a good level of knowledge on the field. They can ask also a professional certification, but that is given by our partners. So We would like to ask the betters, those with a great scientific background and also lots of experience in the field. Meaning we need to talk!
- They must be able to teach and train horse and studentss and
- they must have the basic professions two questions before an must make a Hospitation in minimum 2 complete educations
- specialist for the subject, university education (BSc, MSc), min of 5 y experience in the field
- Candidates applying to become teachers in our organization must have at least a Master's degree in the field in which they teach. In
 addition, we expect additional courses, training and qualifications in a given subject, as well as many years of practical experience
 and / or in conducting classes for students.
- * You need to be qualified Equine facilitated therapist who is currently working on a field.
- Proven ressurs person in the field. Preferably done own research or proven practical work in the firld

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- A teacher should be a professional in EFT, also they should be able to communicate with students, explain the material, a teacher should have public speaking skills.
- 1)Having the knowledge 2) Experience 3) know how to teach 3) availability
- professionalism, experience in the field of EFT
- Basic education, such as physiotherapist, number of hours completed hippotherapy courses and at least three years' professional experience
- CV of experience, requirement to lecture on CPD events first
- Qualified in their area of expertise
- A lot of experience in theory and practice and instead of taking a profession, looking at the specific qualities that someone must have. Someone with, for example, movement science plus extra courses for the specific target group, can also give hippotherapy/EFT (after a lot of theory/practice experience in EFT)
- Knowledge of human and/or equine diseases and facilitated therapy.

Conclusion of the common criteria for teachers The Therapist-Teacher must

- BE QUALIFIED (education) in own profession and as Equine Facilitated Therapist = to have professional competences to adapt own profession to EFT and competences to work with the Equine (COMPETENCY OF OWN PROFESSIONAL FIELD, EFT AND THE EQUINE) to be able to teach the students
- HAVE PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE in the field to give <u>own case</u> <u>examples when teaching and guiding</u> students when practicing
- HAVE TEACHING AND TRAINING EXPERIENCE/ Guidance/education = <u>competences how to teach EFT in theory</u> <u>and practice</u> and how to teach/guide students (adults)

Teaching students/ trainees to become EAS providers

The following have been identified as necessary <u>key elements</u> of the 'Supervisor – Trainee' relationship in the context of Equine Assisted Services (EAS)

- 1. A supervision model that focuses on a reflective and supportive process between the supervisor and trainee in order to foster trainee's personal and professional development.
- 2. A supervision model includes <u>an open, supportive and safe environment</u> with an agreement between the supervisor and trainee on the key elements of supervision. The supervision planning process will include the discussion and development of goals and agreement of expectations and methodology.
- 3. <u>Timely</u> support enables the best results for learning.
- 4. <u>Supervision approaches</u> may include supervisor feedback, peer feedback and/or trainee self-evaluation and self-reflection of the basic competencies needed to understand EAS's in context.
- 5. The supervisor has both evidence-based <u>knowledge</u> and demonstrates a strong <u>experience</u> of the principles of supervision and of Equine Assisted Services (EAS).
- 6. It is acknowledged that supervision may vary between countries and supervision practices may require a blended approach such as cultural nuances.

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HETI Ethical Guidelines

 HETI Ethical Guidelines are a base <u>integrated into</u> the entire <u>educational process</u> (and to further education of the Service providers). They include the <u>horse and service provider</u> and are brought to the knowledge of the service user (and family + cooperating professionals). Ethical guidelines in EAS are supported by evidence based research.
